#### COMMUNITY CONSULTATION SURVEY AND EVENT FOR PLANNED FERRY PORT INFRASTRUCTURE

RPS have been commissioned by Argyll and Bute Council to undertake an Environmental Impact Assessment and Socio-economic Assessment in relation to proposed improvements to the Isle of Gigha and Tayinloan ferry port infrastructure. RPS are conducting two consultation events to engage with the local community with regard to potential socio-economic impacts, both positive and negative, that residents foresee as a result of the project. The first of the two events will be held at Gigha Village Hall on 21st August. The second event will be held at Tayinloan Village Hall on the following day. #### Isle of Gigha Ranger Service

It has been lovely to see a whole host of different butterfly species about the place this month, from the common blue, to the ringlet, meadow brown and small white (cabbage), alongside the uncountable number of baby birds peeping away in our woodlands and on our verges.

A visitor even spotted a crossbill on island, which was an amazing find. To boot, our very own First Gardener spotted a basking shark at the north end of the island, an absolute pleasure to see in our waters!







Our Protecting Gigha's Woodlands Project is still going well. All the identified areas of Rhododendron ponticum and skunk cabbage in Achamore Gardens have been treated. In the process we have uncovered some amazing, previously hidden, Rhododendron species, one of which can be found no where else in the Gardens. Some of the areas where work has been completed are still not safe or accessible, so you may still see some red hazard tape around the place.

Upcoming events in August: guided walk focusing on plant folklore on Saturday 10th August.

#### Isle of Gigha Ranger Service

The Invasive Species removal team are now elsewhere on the island, and the Himalayan Balsam has now flowered in the village, so this will be the war for the next few weeks.

The fencing contractors have also arrived and have started installing the fence lines for our hedgerows, ready for us to plant up in the autumn. We have sourced are trees to be of Scottish provenance, meaning that the seed for these trees was collected in Scotland.



We have also tried our best to support small nurseries and have purchased from other community owned initiatives, such as the Isle of Eigg Tree Nursery. Our hedgerows will be planted based on advice from NatureScot and other tree charities to include hawthorn, blackthorn, elder, wild cherry, hazel, field maple and crab apple to increase the diversity whilst being safe for livestock, support our wildlife, and connect our currently fragmented woodland pockets.

#### Achamore Gardens

While the summer might've finally decided to visit, our Green Team continues to work hard to maintain and execute improvements across the site.

We'd like to say a huge thank you to Gigha's conservation volunteers who completed an enormous amount of renovation work on the south drive. With the clearance of young griselinia and sycamore, the passage has been opened up and notable shrubs including Hydrangea aspera, Buddeleja salvifolia and many more have been uncovered.






#### **Achamore Gardens**

Argyll Invasive Species Management continues to fight back Rhododendron ponticum across the gardens. The team have unveiled a large Rhododendron decorum ssp. diaprepes just as it has come into flower. Located in one of the oldest parts of the garden, this specimen is well established and has scented flowers that have a diameter of approximately 12cm!

The removal of Rhododendron ponticum will help to protect Colonel Horlick's collection of interesting Rhododendron against a water mould known as Phytophthora ramorum. The gardens have recently been visited by SASA (Science & Advice for Scottish Agriculture) who perform annual checks to help us combat the spread of the water mould. This month a sample was taken from a Larch tree (sometimes also affected by Phytophora). Hopefully we will have negative results like last year!

The Walled Gardens are full of colour with our Metrosideros putting on a spectacular display of red flowers. In the main beds Verbena bonariensis, bountiful sweet peas, feathery astilbes and towering cardoons are putting on a delightful show.





It is with great sadness we share that Gigha residents Lynn Cullen and Helen Farquhar have passed away. Our thoughts are with their families.
