Homehunt Gigha

The housing allocation policy used by the Isle of Gigha Heritage Trust is Homehunt Gigha. Anyone interested in renting any Trust housing must be registered with Homehunt Gigha in order to be eligible to apply for Trust housing.

Trust housing is allocated using the following criteria:

- 1. Best use does the applicant fit the best use of the property i.e. using all the available bedrooms.
- 2. Priority Pass awarded does the applicant have a Priority Pass. There are 4 categories of Priority Pass to apply under.
- 3. Date of registration if the first two criteria are equal, the applicant registered first would be allocated the property.

Another residents' picnic, another absolutely beautiful day! We want to say a massive thank you to everyone who joined us, as well as to Lolita at Wild Chameleon and Heather Gorman for providing such a delicious picnic. It truly is one of the best afternoons of the year!

All four wind turbines are up and running again, although there are a couple of small faults leading to the turbines tripping off. Parts are on order to resolve these issues.

Isle of Gigha Ranger Service

The month of May seems to have flown by, but we can certainly say that the weather has brought on all the amazing wildflowers and plant growth.

Our INNS (invasive non-native species) project is going well, having undertaken most of the Rhododendron ponticum removal in the Fire Station woodland and Achamore Gardens, and now beginning more fully at Gallochoille. The skunk cabbage has also been hit hard in Achamore Gardens and the woodland to the east of the Gardens (also known as the Spoot). In the coming weeks with the better weather, work will be starting at Ardaily. We will be looking to close off sections at Ardaily to ensure public safety due to the use of chainsaws and other power tools. This may also include some of the sections of the Western Link path at certain times. We will be sure to make any restrictions obvious and well advertised.



We also ran our medicinal plants and tea making walk. We took a gentle ramble down the Druimyeon Bay Link path taking a closer look at some easily identifiable plants and chatting about their medicinal properties throughout time and nowadays. We then made some tea infusions at Druimyeon Bay using nettles, silverweed, sorrel, hawthorn and bramble leaves. We had such beautiful weather for the walk – thank you to everyone who came along, it was fabulous!

An absolute delight this month has been our marine biology project with Gigha Primary School relating to the science curriculum. We have been exploring solid, liquid and gases in the marine environment, experimenting with hydrophones to see how marine creatures hear in the air and in the water and the ways they communicate through echolocation. We also headed to Leim beach to explore pollution in solid, liquid and gas form, testing the pH and acidity of the water (an increase due to additional gases as a result of climate change), the health of the water by catching plankton (how liquid spills can affect our whole food chain) in our own beach-made nets, and carrying out a beach clean to remove solid pollution from our coastal sites. Our next sessions will look at the range of biodiversity, lifecycles and food chains in our marine environment, and spend time making banners and sculptures for an environmental awareness parade at the Sound of Gigha festival.

Gigha Primary School & Early Learning Centre

This month both the Early Learning Centre (ELC) and Primary School have been taking part in Beach Schools. Whilst the ELC join with their friends each week from Rhunahaorine ELC, Primary pupils have been taking part in specific marine science sessions with IGHT Ranger, Casey-Jo. Pupils have visited several beaches around the island for these sessions and have been learning about the effects of climate change on our local environment. Pupils also took part in a beach clean and identified marine plastic which was able to be recycled. Pupils working on protecting our local environment will culminate in an environmental parade on 8th June at the Sound of Gigha weekend where they will share what they have created in these sessions with the community.

This month also saw the start of our long-awaited swimming lessons. Each week, the whole school travel to Campbeltown for a hour session at Aqualibrium. Sessions have focussed around developing pupils skills within the pool alongside increasing water confidence. Pupils really enjoy these sessions which form part of their PE curriculum.

In order to ensure we can afford swimming lessons next summer, we will be holding our Summer Fair and Pet Show on Saturday 15th June at Gigha Primary School and ELC. The Pet show will begin at 10.30am before the Summer Fair opens for soup and sandwiches from 12-3pm. Pupils will also be raising funds through a cake and bottle stall, guess the number of sweets in the jar and a raffle. 
